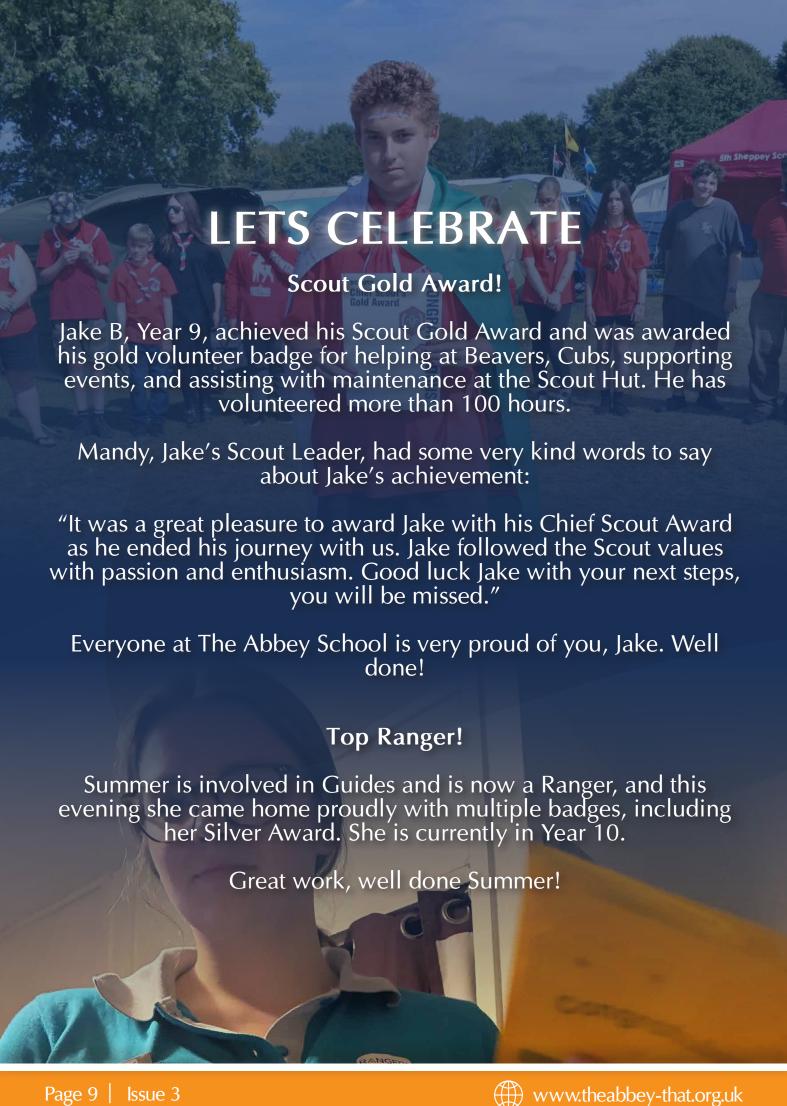

PASTORAL SPOTLIGHT ON.... PERIODS AND HOW TO COPE

Periods are a part of growing up – approximately half of the population will have periods at some point in their lives. Although natural, periods can be inconvenient and tricky to manage, but with a little planning and support they can be easier to navigate whilst at

Many young people suffer with cramps, aches and pains. A painkiller can be taken under parental supervision which may help.

Lots of young people find it helpful to track their period with an app on a smart phone or tablet, meaning they have more awareness of the date their period may start. 'Clue' and 'Flo' are both popular.

Adhesive heat pads are readily available to buy from chemists, and can be a comfort without posing a health and safety risk, as they maintain a low warmth whilst in direct contact with the skin.

We understand the issues and complications around using the school toilets, and we will always do our best to help a student who needs an adjustment whilst on their period. Please let the pastoral team know if your child needs help, or they can pop in to see us.

Periods can be expensive, and in a world where many families are under financial pressure, we will do our best to help. If you need a care pack or sanitary supplies, please let the pastoral team know, or ask your child to pop in to see us. We also have spare items of clothing for emergencies, and we encourage students to bring in spare clothes if needed, which they are welcome to leave with us in a named bag.

We understand, and we are here to help. The important thing is that students are in school, learning to manage with our help.

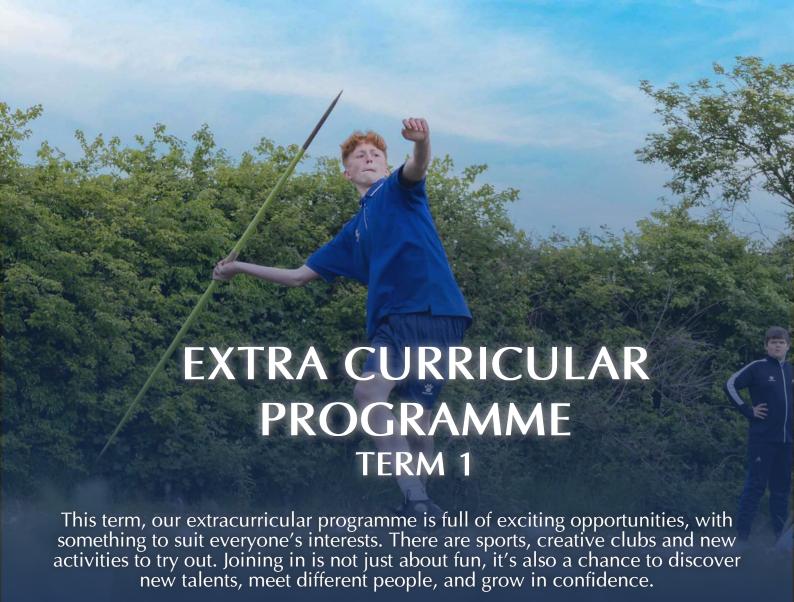

I'm Mrs Blythe, the school's Specialist Intervention Practitioner. My role is to support the emotional well-being of our students, helping them feel safe, understood, and ready to thrive.

How I Support Students

I offer a range of gentle, therapeutic interventions tailored to individual needs, including:

- · Walk and Talk Therapy with Freddy, our friendly therapy dog
- · Sand Tray Work a creative, non-verbal way to explore emotions
- Drawing and Talking one-to-one and small group sessions
- · Talk Time a quiet, confidential space where students can speak freely, feel heard, and begin to process their thoughts
- · Bereavement Support for those coping with loss
- Emotional Nurture Groups to build confidence and coping strategies.

Emotional Wellbeing Groups

These small, nurturing sessions help students:

- · Understand and express emotions
- Build resilience and self-awareness
- · Learn healthy coping strategies

Activities may include:

- Emotion-focused worksheets
- · Play-based emotional card work
- Short educational videos

How You Can Help at Home

Your support is invaluable. You can help by:

- Encouraging open conversations
- · Creating calm, consistent routines
- Noticing changes in mood or behaviour
- · Reaching out if you feel your child may benefit from support

Consideration In The Community

Most of you are wonderful ambassadors of the school through your kind and considerate actions towards others in our local community, especially when travelling to and from school.

Remember its not fair for anyone to be allowed to deliberately make life miserable for others. We will never tolerate nasty behaviour or bullying towards those in our school community. Always ask an adult for help if you are being treated unkindly or if you feel frustrated about the ways others are treating you.

DO

Move aside on the pavement to allow to use it.

Speak using appropriate tone and at a sensible level to those you are with, using language that is not offensive or swearing.

Cross roads safely, using the bridge to navigate the A3 and by looking up and checking the traffic for all other streets where there are no pedestrian crossing facilities

DO NOT

Monopolise the whole pavement space by walking in a group forcing elderly, those with prams or indeed anyone from the community into the road.

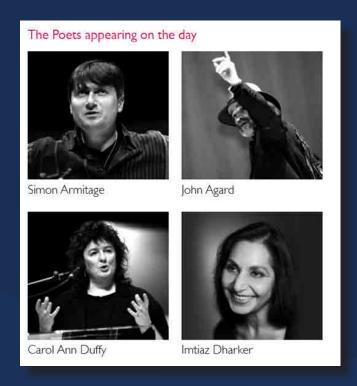
Apollo Victoria Theatre, London, on Thursday 13th February 3036.
