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PASTORAL SPOTLIGHT ON.... AI BOTS

Our young people are growing up in a world with AI – Artificial Intelligence.

Whilst AI can have many positive uses and can be used to help in many areas of life, it does also pose some risks to young people in certain formats.

We are seeing an increase in young people using AI ChatBots. These are often designed in a format to deliberately tempt young people to engage, offering character chats and interactions, and storyline chats. The images used on these unregulated websites can appeal to younger children, but they are not necessarily reflective of the content of the website.

Some may well be suitable, but in the main these AI sites are unmonitored and unfiltered websites, with content that is not only age inappropriate but also extremely unpleasant, with flags for violent content and emotive topics that need trusted adult support to fully understand.

There are some safer AI options such as Chat GPT – however this requires an age of 13 minimum and parental or guardian consent to use, up to age 18. Please be aware of what your children are accessing and remember that if they are interacting with AI then their algorithms on their devices will then suggest more and similar sites.
