#### **Term 2 Week 3 - Mock Examinations**

We'd like to send our congratulations to all year 11 students on their conduct and attitude to what has been a very successful first week of this term's mock examinations. We wish all of them the very best for week two and hope that all the preparation over the next few days helps them to be in the best position to succeed.



#### **Music Lessons Opportunity!**

On Thursday, students in Y7 and 8 received a music demo assembly from Andrew Parry who informed them of an exciting opportunity we have starting at The Abbey School. This year Music has been re-established on our KS3 curriculum meaning pupils in Year 7 and 8 are currently experiencing one lesson a fortnight in Music. Students are learning a variety of topics across the year:

#### Year 7:

- Singing
- Kevboard
- Exploring Instruments of an Orchestra

#### Year 8:

- Ukulele
- The Blues
- Exploring Popular Songs

In addition to this, our current year 8 pupils will have the opportunity to choose Music as a GCSE subject next year. Those students considering GCSE Music may benefit from engaging in private musical instrument lessons. Therefore The Abbey School is pleased to inform you that we are going to start offering this with the teaching company *Andrew Parry Music*. These lessons will take place during school time and will be taught by external peripatetic teachers. To begin with, the instruments available to learn are guitar, drum kit, piano/keyboard and voice.

At this stage in the process, we are keen to find out about those who would be interested in having lessons, we cannot guarantee all lessons will go ahead until we have further details on interest. If lessons do go ahead, you will be notified with a schedule and further information. If you do wish to apply please visit <a href="https://example.com/apply-For Lessons">Apply For Lessons — Andrew Parry Music</a> to register your interest.

Lessons do cost and this is something arranged directly with Andrew Parry Music.

- Individual 30 mins: £16.00 per lesson [£80 for 1 term]
- Individual 20 mins: £11.00 per lesson [£55 for 1 term]

The company usually aim to teach 5 lessons per student each term, however, due to school activities and term lengths, sometimes this is not possible. In these cases lessons run forwards into the next term. Eg: a student may have 4 lessons one term and then 6 in the next. A full year of lessons is typically 30.

**Payments:** It is standard practice for the teachers to send out lesson invoices via email at the beginning of every half term. Instructions for payment by bank transfer can be found on your invoice. Andrew Parry prefer this method of payment as it is more secure. Payment is directly made with Andrey Parry Music and not The Abbey School.

#### **Edible Culture Visit**



On Monday 13<sup>th</sup> November, 10 students attended a workshop at Edible Culture, the garden centre on site. We were shown around the areas surrounding the nursery, and given a talk about how to compost different materials and the way in which material is broken down. We were taught how to make our own compost area using wooden pallets. We were then given really useful information on how to create a forest garden for wildlife, using nut trees and herbs, and having water butts to give birds a source of water. We were also advised about the best season to plant trees and fruit bushes, as well as herbs and vegetables.

Edible Culture have kindly agreed to come over to our gardening sites at the Abbey and advise us on how to set up gardens which allow us to grow fruit and vegetables, as well as cater for wildlife. They have also said that they will be able to donate some trees. Students asked some really great questions and hopefully now know how to transfer some of these great ideas to the Abbey grounds.



On a separate note, we have also been donated 1000 bulbs by Faversham rotary club, so anyone wanting to come and help us plant these (as well as helping set up the gardens), may be interested to join eco-gardening and craft club on a Monday 3:30-4:30. Last week we made friendship bracelets and did some origami, and we are looking to making some seasonal gifts as well in the coming weeks!




