Monitoring and implementation

At The Abbey School, we assessed the effect of this expenditure and the positive impact on the educational attainment of those pupils in the following ways:

Measure	Activity
Priority 1	Internal progress tracking, programme feedback, staff feedback, GCSE outcomes, assessment tracking.
Priority 2	Internal progress tracking, programme feedback, staff feedback, GCSE outcomes, assessment tracking from NTP. Increased number of interventions, increase in support for PP pupils through support, meeting time and resource allocation.
Priority 3	100% of pupils able to access the on-line tutoring, no session from the NTP is interrupted as a result of lack of equipment or technology
Priority 4	Increased attendance, increased commitment to learning, pupils/parental feedback, internal progress tracking, GCSE outcomes. The number of interactions between vulnerable pupils and the school increases. Individual pupils are more quickly identified and supported in order that they access lessons.
Priority 5	Support for senior leaders to increase outcomes in the school. Programme feedback.
Priority 6	Programme feedback. University and careers outcomes.
